

# The Peaceful Voice

21st April 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

## This Sunday's Reflection

The Gospel reading for this Sunday focuses on Jesus' depiction of himself as the Good Shepherd. Jesus uses the imagery of a shepherd caring for his sheep to convey profound truths about his relationship with his followers.

Firstly, Jesus identifies himself as the Good Shepherd who is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. This shows the sacrificial nature of Jesus' love for humanity. Unlike a hired hand who might flee when danger arises, Jesus demonstrates his unwavering commitment to his flock by willingly giving up his life for their sake. This act of selflessness underscores the depth of Jesus' love and his desire to protect and guide his followers.

Secondly, Jesus speaks about the intimacy of his relationship with his sheep. He emphasises that his sheep know him and recognise his voice. This signifies the personal connection Jesus desires to have with each individual. Just as a shepherd knows each of his sheep by name, Jesus knows and cares for each of his followers intimately. He calls them by name and leads them with love and compassion.

Moreover, Jesus draws a stark contrast between himself and the thief, as well as the hired hand. While they come with destructive intentions, Jesus comes to offer abundant life. This sharp distinction underscores the genuine care and provision Jesus extends, in contrast to the deceitful motives of those who seek to exploit and harm.

Lastly, Jesus speaks about his relationship with the Father, emphasising his obedience to the Father's will. He highlights the unity between himself and the Father, stating that he lays down his life of his own accord in obedience to the Father's command. This underscores Jesus' divinity and the harmony within the Godhead.



Engaging with this passage in deep reflection invites us to plumb the depths of Jesus' love for us and the level of intimacy he desires to have with each of us. It beckons us to listen intently to his voice, to place our trust in his guidance, and to follow him faithfully as our Good Shepherd. By doing so, we can partake in the abundant life and eternal security that Jesus promises to those who belong to his flock.

#### Parish Pastoral Council

As has been promoted the past two weeks, OLQP will be starting a new Parish Pastoral Council in June of this year. If you've been away or missed seeing the news about this, simply check back to the bulletins of 7th and 14th April at www.olqp.org.au - There is a widespread trend in the Church in this era not to hold elections for groups such as Pastoral Councils. At first this might seem strange, but many people across the Australian Church have found that Parish Pastoral Council elections can be a bit ineffective in terms of many of those voting not knowing the candidates beyond, perhaps a name or two. This has been particularly noted as the case in large parishes.

Hence, a frequently preferred approach to sourcing members for a Parish Pastoral Council is by individuals discerning their calling and suitability for such a ministry, with the support of relevant parish staff. So, that's the gentle process we're in at the moment. A number of people have been in touch for a chat so far, to start seeing if this or some other channel of service would be most suitable for their gifts.
