This Sunday's Reflection

entecost commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and disciples, as recounted in the Book of Acts. It's also a celebration of the birth of the Church and the empowerment of believers to be heralds of the Good News of Our Lord to the world. In reflecting on the main gospel theme for Pentecost Sunday in year B, which often revolves around the passage from John 20:19-23, we encounter themes of empowerment, reconciliation, and mission.

In this gospel passage, Jesus appears to his disciples after his resurrection, breathing the Holy Spirit upon them and commissioning them to continue his work of forgiveness and reconciliation. The imagery of breath and spirit is rich with symbolism, conveying the transformative power of God's presence in the lives of believers. Through the Holy Spirit, the disciples are emboldened to proclaim the message of salvation and to extend God's mercy and forgiveness to others.

This theme of empowerment and mission finds resonance in Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si, which calls for a renewed sense of responsibility and stewardship towards the earth, our common home. In Laudato Si. Pope Francis emphasises the interconnectedness of all creation and the urgent need for ecological conversion. He challenges us to be attentive and respond to the needs of the time, the cry of the poor, and to embrace a lifestyle of simplicity, solidarity, and sustainability.

The connection between evangelisation and caring for creation becomes apparent when we recognise that



our mission as Christians is not just to proclaim the gospel in words but also to embody its values in our actions. Caring for the environment is a tangible expression of our love for God and our neighbour. When we work to protect and preserve the natural world, we are participating in God's ongoing work of creation and redemption - we are demonstrating our commitment to justice, stewardship, and the common good.

Ultimately, Pentecost Sunday reminds us that the same Spirit who empowered the disciples to proclaim the message of salvation continues to work in and through us today. As we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit, may we be inspired to live as faithful stewards of God's creation, sharing the good news of Christ's love and mercy with all people and all of creation.

25th May: Walking the Labyrinth (half day)

In the labyrinth you enter a spiritual journey. It is a safe space, but one which challenges boundaries in order to create hope. There you may safely bring to the surface that which, held within, needs to come into the light. There are two labyrinths at Winbourne, a seven circuit and an eleven circuit (Chartres style).

8th June: Being Pentecost People (full day)

After his resurrection, Jesus the Christ stayed a little longer, tying up some lose ends and continuing to prepare his disciples for life and ministry after his ascension. Then he left us, with the admonition from the Last Supper to `be him' still calling us towards both contemplative and active life.

22nd June: Kinds of Prayer – Finding Ways to Pray (full day)

Prayer is communication; relationship addressed, respected and taken further. It is letting God get at you, requiring an open heart and an open mind and a response from our deepest depths.
