# Social Justice Sunday 2024 Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World

Social Justice Sunday asks the Catholic community in Australia to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues of our time. Each year, the Australian Catholic Bishops release a statement to remind us of the social dimension of the mission of the Church. Last Tuesday, in Camilleri Hall, Bishop Vincent Long, local political members, representatives from other dioceses and agencies together with parishioners and students from our local catholic primary and secondary schools attended the launch of the 2024-2025 Social Justice Statement, Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World. The statement reflects on the present day together with the Gospel, sees the violence and asks why the world is as it is and what is needed to bring peace.

The statement highlights many areas of concern for our consideration. One significant area is how we understand truth.

In recent times disinformation and misinformation have become more widespread. Disinformation is information which is false and the person or organisation disseminating it, knows it to be untrue. Misinformation is information, which is false, but those disseminating it believe it to be true. Disinformation and misinformation may not be new but what is new is the way the internet and social media have enabled widespread and rapid dissemination of such information.

With increasing disinformation and misinformation comes the greater risk of conflict, as there becomes no such things as 'truth' and 'lies'.

This points to a crisis of truth which creates in turn a crisis of trust.

Without trust there can be no peace. Truth creates trust and trust creates peace. Speak truth to build trust and build trust to make peace. To speak the truth is already the beginning of peace-making.

Think of chaos as dancing raspberries,

imagine grief as the outbreath of beauty or the gesture of fish. Swim for the other side.

Wage peace.

Never has the world seemed so fresh and precious. Have a cup of tea and rejoice. Act as if armistice has already arrived. Don't wait another minute.


