# "Love One Another": Living Christ's Commandment in **Our Catholic Families**

"I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." - John 13:34-35

These words from Jesus are a timeless call to action, especially for our Catholic families today. Amidst the challenges of modern life—busy schedules, digital distractions, and a growing culture of individualism—our homes are still called to be places where Christ's love is made visible. Our Catholic families, with their rich diversity and deep sense of community, have a vital role to play in witnessing this love in everyday life.

#### LIVING LOVE AT HOME

For love to flourish in the wider world, it must first be nurtured at home. The family is the "domestic Church," where faith and love are first experienced and expressed.

#### 1. Everyday Acts of Care and Respect

In a culture that values fairness and mateship, our Catholic families can go further by modelling Christ's selfless love. Serving one another with generosity—doing chores without complaint, caring for ageing parents, or simply being available to each other—is a powerful way to live the Gospel at home.



#### BEING WITNESSES IN THE COMMUNITY

The love experienced at home should not stop there. Our families can be a quiet yet strong witness in our neighbourhoods, schools, workplaces, and wider community.

#### 1. Embracing Hospitality

We are called to be welcoming. Our families can do this by creating spaces of warmth-inviting neighbours, fellow parishioners, or newcomers into our homes and lives. Simple acts of hospitality reflect the love of God.

#### 2. Living Faith Proudly

In today's society, it can be countercultural to live openly as Catholics. But when our families attend Mass regularly, celebrate feast days, and uphold Christian values with consistency and joy, they stand out—not by being preachy, but by being faithful.

#### 3. Serving Together

Whether it's volunteering at Vinnies, joining a parish outreach, or supporting environmental initiatives in line with Laudato Si', our families can live out love through service. Doing so together strengthens family bonds and shows the world a faith that acts.

#### 4. Practicing Forgiveness

Every family faces tensions, but it's how we respond that shows our Christian identity. Choosing forgiveness, saying sorry, and starting again—even when it's hard—is one of the clearest ways to mirror Christ's love.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Jesus' command to "love one another" is not limited by time or place—it is for every family, in every street, suburb, and town. When our Catholic families love generously, serve humbly, and pray faithfully, we become true disciples of Christ. In doing so, we offer the wider world a glimpse of a better way—rooted in faith, built on love, and open to all.
