Last weekend's parish bulletin was necessarily overtaken by the news of Pope Francis and also by our parish news of Fr Jack. So, a week later, this is a chance to acknowledge the efforts to make the recent Holy Week Week and Easter possible. People with hearts of service don't expect to see their name in a credits list. And in any case, if we were to list names here we'd miss many who did (and do) lots of things in the background like serve coffees, make outsiders welcome or help people in the crowd with babies or who are less mobile to find seats.

SIX TIMES!

Every time we gather involves background preparation that most don't see or realise. Even just across the days from Palm Sunday to Easter Monday, for example, the decoration in the church was changed SIX times for the various changes of focus. And every time, the church was voluntarily cleaned! Printed materials – whether bulletins, signage or spiritual cards and mission materials, were composed, prepared and printed and their distribution organised. Every liturgy required meticulous planning, with flow sheets prepared that aren't publicly seen, so that every movement and everyone involved in any aspect of ministry is on the same page; from presiding to music to slides to serving, MC-ing, reading, collecting, IT and screens etc etc....

WHY?

And the aim of all of this is to try to best support the worship of God and the receiving of God's grace through the liturgy – for all of us to go out recharged into life again as loving disciples. Hopefully all of us had a graced moment or two across those very special days and some impetus for our ongoing growth in our faith and purpose. Among the thousands of attendees across that week who are less regularly connected, please God they felt welcome – and encouraged in their lives and faith – and in God's call for their ongoing growth too. Thanks from all of us across the whole parish – to ANYONE who contributed to a spirit

of welcome. Easter itself teaches us that divine things can powerfully and unexpectedly happen through human channels. So never underestimate what even a small gesture of friendship at the church can enable for someone!



THANKS BE TO GOD!

Every liturgy for Holy Week and Easter has themes and focuses that call for music selection and rehearsing (in choir cases, for many weeks before!). Those themes and focuses call for readers to be prepared, for commentaries and pravers to be created and written, for hundreds of slides to be prepared, for homilies to be crafted and crowds to be welcomed. Offering collections need to be organised, documented, tallied and accounted, which takes days following to complete! Each liturgy calls for preparation of logistics and for the big ones, did you know that even all our junior altar servers came for rehearsals? Toilets need cleaning between crowds, outdoor chairs packed, security assured and tidy ups on the run ready for the next crowd. Even after the magnificent Easter Vigil and crowd, Easter still needs to happen in the church for the bulk of the community, hence four more gatherings on the Sunday to be served and supported afresh.

For all of the elements mentioned above and for the people who made them possible, may we all give sincere thanks to God. May this season of Easter through to Pentecost continue as a time especially open to God's grace in all of our lives.
