The Road from Jerusalem to Jericho is Not Far Away

I still remember a sentence from my childhood catechism class that has stayed with me through all these years: "The road from Jerusalem to Jericho is not somewhere so far. It can be within the boundary of our parish. It can even be within the church itself—from the many doors we enter, all the way to the altar."

Now, I understand those words more deeply.

That road from Jesus' parable—the road where a wounded man was ignored by many but saved by the kindness of one—runs not just through ancient Israel. It runs right here.

It winds through Old Prospect Road, Greystanes Road, and Merrylands Road, stretches to the Cumberland Highway and the Great Western Highway, and touches every street and corner around them. It passes through the pews of our church and into the hearts of the people who sit in them.

Every week, our church fills with people. But many come carrying burdens we cannot see. Among us are the elderly walking with difficulty, those in wheelchairs, widows and widowers holding onto memories, young families overwhelmed by daily life, teenagers searching for meaning, and parishioners with hearts quietly aching. Even in this sacred space, there are many who are wounded—not always in body, but often in spirit.

But where there is pain, there is also compassion. And thank God, there are Good Samaritans among us.

They are not always noticed, but they are everywhere. They are the ones who bring Holy Communion to the sick and elderly, often visiting homes with a gentle word and a reverent heart. They are the readers who proclaim the Word, the altar servers who assist faithfully, the musicians and choir members who offer their gifts to lift our hearts. They are the volunteers who clean the church, decorate it with flowers, and arrange everything behind the scenes, asking for nothing in return.

They are the ones who smile at the elderly, greet strangers with kindness, offer a seat, or walk slowly beside someone who needs a little more time. Even the simplest gestures—offering a hand, a kind word, or a quiet prayer—can carry the love of Christ.



I even remember someone who brought me a hot coffee from the nearby café on a cold, windy, rainy Sunday morning—just after the 7:00 AM Mass. I was tired and chilled, and that small act of kindness warmed more than just my hands. I don't remember his name, but I will never forget what he did.

It reminded me: even in the Gospel, the Good Samaritan is never named. Because love does not seek recognition. It simply *acts*.

Here in our parish, we are surrounded by people who quietly live out the Gospel. Their names may never be announced. Their stories may never be known. But their kindness speaks volumes. Their service, though often unseen, brings healing, hope, and holiness.

Let us open our eyes and our hearts. The road from Jerusalem to Jericho is not far away

It runs through our neighbourhoods, our streets, and our church.

It runs beside the lonely, the tired, and the wounded.

Let us not walk past.

Let us stop, notice, and care.

Let us be Good Samaritans—here and now, in Greystanes. In the heart of Christ.

The Ministry of Care Course, I attended was offered by the Parramatta Diocese for those who visit the sick and dying in hospitals, aged care facilities and homes. It was held on Wednesday evenings at the Bishop Heather Centre in Blacktown.

The Course entailed:

Wk1: Pastoral Care and Safeguarding.

Wk2: Jesus our Model of Ministry.

Wk3: Skills in Pastoral Care.

Wk4: A Holistic Approach to Pastoral Care.

The course offered us practical skills - to understand safeguarding guidelines within the Ministry to the Sick, how to be an active listener, to distinguish between empathy versus sympathy, to understand diverse needs and set professional and consistent boundaries for pastoral care. At the core of this "Model of Ministry" it is rooted in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

For me doing this Course has given me the opportunity to develop a deeper engagement with my faith, providing me with opportunities to explore and reflect the concepts of suffering, grace, and the nature of God, and improve my understanding and response to the diverse experiences and needs within and outside of the ministry context.

I can say, without any reservation that "The Ministry of Care Course" provides a solid grounding for understanding pastoral care and would assist interested participants in gaining strength in their faith, and equip them with knowledge and skills to provide compassionate and effective support in their ministry.
