What more can we do?

I can still remember well that very day when I sat down on the floor beside my bed and prayed intensely and intimately to God: "Lord, this is the life I want, the life I desire, if it is your will, I will do my best to fulfill it". This was after a five-day journey in the mountains of Papua New Guinea, when after hours of daily walk heading towards different villages, we were each time met by a group of villagers with their drums and joyful dancing and be handed a coconut to drink to quench our thirst. Seeing the joy and excitement in the faces of those people especially the children approaching us gave me that deep thought that indeed, people are longing for God and the Gospel. The simplicity of life and the joy of community moved me to do my share in spreading the faith in God in that mission experience as a seminarian. That was more than twenty years ago.



After almost twenty years as a missionary priest and having been sent to different mission posts, I continually ask myself, "to where am I still called to serve and what more can I do?" Though I was not sent back to Papua New Guinea after my ordination and though in the recent years I have thought that my dream mission was in a place where you have the mountains on the one side and the beach on the other (I have seen such place in the Cook Islands where I was for three months before coming here to Australia!), God has been calling me to tasks and places where I continue to seek for ways to be of service.

For this reason, the story of Martha and Mary in the Gospel is an inspiration to find where and what God calls us to be more. The "better part" which Jesus seemed to commend was not that Mary was sitting before the Lord, listening intently to his teachings while Martha was up and about in her service of hospitality. No. We need prayer. We need action. Both are needed in the Church. The "better part" however which the Lord said Mary should not be deprived of, was the fact that Mary saw, Mary realized, and Mary considered the other

possibilities she can do and become, in expressing her love for the Lord. "Martha, Martha....", her name was repeated twice. It was a loving invitation by Jesus to see more in herself than she thought possible, in her relationship with the Lord. Martha, Martha you can do more! Martha, Martha ask yourself, "What more can I do in my love for the Lord?"

Mother Teresa once said, "If there are poor people on the moon, we will go there too". So imagine a group of nuns training to become astronauts so that they can go to the moon and serve the poor. The point however is not the "going to the moon" but the attitude of keeping ourselves open to the possibilities to respond to needs, of making ourselves available to the call of the times, of keeping ourselves open to God's invitation, of allowing ourselves to be led by God to what really pleases him.

For the past month since I came to the parish, I am amazed at the sight of parishioners, the young as well as the not so young, who continue to serve and find ways to do more and be better. This empowers me, and hopefully, each one of us to serve Jesus and the parish community and find ways other than what we have been used to — what more can I do and what possibilities can I become in my love for the Lord?
