QUEEN OF PEACE

PARISH PROPERTY and FINANCIAL HEALTH

As many know, we presented a major parish property report in the second half of last year with a quite detailed survey of parishioner response. A lot of work has gone on in the background since then and please God, we will soon be able to bring together a couple of large parts of a property vision to give the parish a repaired and sustainable base. The news I'm sharing with you here concerns just one piece of those plans in which there is now a solid direction.

Brief background to help inform newcomers to the parish:

For many years now, the parish has been operating at 'break even' after each year's costs, charges and charitable outreach are balanced against donations/income. Weekly donations from parishioners form more than 90% of our total parish income. We currently receive \$30k from children's services on the property but everything else is donation only. Some think that the diocese funds the parishes. This is not the case. The parishes in fact support the important works of the diocese! The OLQP reality has long been 'break even' and for a parish this size, there is a very low level of savings/reserves that would be gone in a month or two if we started the backlog of needed repairs and upgrades. Clearly, this 'break even' history, whilst not leaving debt, has seen a progressive deterioration of assets now needing expensive response. In the words of a longest standing member of the parish finance committee; 'our brittle church windows have needed replacing for 15 years! The windows are just one item on a long list for our church and property.

Big progress for our current child care story: For three years we have been working through further child care options in partnership with 'Ambrose' (the child services wing of a diocese company called 'Community Ventures') – to extend services and create an assured, ongoing parish income source. Due to regulatory requirements and working through many pros and cons, we've repeatedly gone back to the drawing board to try to find a way to best use our double storey former convent building and land adjacent to the primary school (corner Old Prospect and Braeside Roads). IT'S NOW HAPPENING. A project manager is employed, the planning is well progressed and renovation of the building starts next week! The time frame is tight but the goal is to open a long day early learning centre in 2026! AND the current service of our small pre-school will continue.

I'm very happy to let you know that we are taking this new step of expanded service and parish income, with NO INTERIM DEBT to the parish. Lots more to update as we go but I wanted to share this good news!
